

Press Release / Friday 23 October 2020 SITE GALLERY LAUNCHES BOUNCE! BY FLORENCE BLANCHARD, A LARGE-SCALE INSTALLATION IN SITE SQUARE, BROWN STREET, S1 2BS.



- This landmark project transforms a dormant public square in central Sheffield into a unique creative space.
- The 1000 sqm floor painting is outdoors and can be freely accessed by everyone.
- The project was commissioned through City of Ideas a placemaking programme led by Site Gallery and a consortia of Sheffield arts organisations based in the Cultural Industries Quarter.

Sheffield-based artist Florence Blanchard is known internationally for her work transforming city spaces with her signature style of flowing, amorphous shapes in bright colours. Working in partnership with playground paint specialist Uniplay she has transformed an area 1000 sqm into a vibrant, playful focal point for the Cultural Industries Quarter.

Florence Blanchard, Artist, said:

"I always thought this park could do with a bit of colour and so I was really excited when Site Gallery invited me to design a visual for a floor painting. I knew exactly what I wanted to do: the design needed to be bold and colourful to contrast with the concrete and the steel. My aim was to create a welcoming environment that would help people notice the space and its elements and invite passersby to walk through it. I took inspiration from colours and shapes that were already present in the park. I used vibrant, bright mostly primary colours and the composition is meant to convey the impression of flowing motion going diagonally through the space. The shapes follow the architectural layout and bounce from one element to another. I am very pleased with the result and hope it will bring a bit of distraction to Sheffielders as we are going through a historical difficult time."

Judith Harry, Executive Director of Site Gallery, said:

"The impact of Florence's work is remarkable. It has added a whole new dimension to the public realm around Site Gallery and is a wonderful addition to a series of public artworks we have commissioned in the area over the past couple of years. Florence has recognised the untapped potential of the square and created an environment which celebrates the creativity of the cultural industries quarter"

"This artwork is a great addition to the CIQ which over the past 3 years, has been transformed by the Knowledge Gateway programme and projects such as the Site Gallery expansion. We encourage people to come down to Brown Street and view it along with other public realm work by Sheffield based artists including Tim Etchells, Jo Peel and Paul Morrison in the Brown Street area"

Further information:

The square, opposite Site Gallery, was originally built as an outdoor space for the National Museum of Pop Music. After the museum closed in 2001, the square remained a predominantly unused space.

In 2017 Site Gallery secured a 3-year funding package from Arts Council England's Ambition for Excellence programme, to deliver City of Ideas, a placemaking programme which would bring together local stakeholders, artists and designers to collaborate on improving the public realm within the Cultural Industries Quarter.

Through a series of large and small scale interventions and collaborations, City of Ideas has been exploring how the area around Brown Street/Paternoster Row can better look, feel and operate for the local community of residents, creatives and workers in the Cultural Industries Quarter. From basic clean ups and adding plants and greenery, to weekend festival takeovers, the square has now been given a new life.
