

ABOUT

For *Before, During & After: Here Soon/Here Now (How To Keep The Balance)* London-based artist Appau Jnr Boakye-Yiadom continues to build on an ongoing project of learning to play the drums. He works on learning a single drum track, capturing the journey through audio recordings, moving image and photography.

His work references how infrequently we are permitted to learn as adults, revealing his learning processes and disrupting the idea that artists are masters in a skill or craft. He has collaborated with photographers and videographers, exploring different ways of capturing live learning without the body in the frame or main subject of focus.

Boakye-Yiadom explores communication, support and human history as intertwined. This is exposed through the process of making and learning as an intrinsic part of the work. Subsequently, the artist's drumming skills are re-learnt after periods without funding and evolve when support is given. Contradiction, fluctuations and uncertainty are an unavoidable part of this exposed ongoing project.

An exciting events programme will accompany the exhibition, including family friendly workshops, skills development and talks. More to be announced soon.

ABOUT APPAU JNR BOAKYE-YIADOM

Appau Jnr Boakye-Yiadom works across multi-disciplinary practice including found materials and objects, sculpture, photography, sound, performance, archive and self-produced moving image.

He creates installations where the mediums are ever-evolving, remodelled and constantly conversing with each other. His work exists and exposes the different steps in its process, with multilayered references exploring where parameter lines are lucid, murky and faint. Snippets of film footage and fragments of sound are incorporated into the works, as well as collaborations with musicians for live improvisation.

ABOUT SITE GALLERY

Sheffield's contemporary art space Site Gallery specialises in new media, moving image and performance. Pioneering emerging art practices and ideas, Site works in partnership with local, regional and international collaborators to nurture artistic talent and support the development of contemporary art.
